## WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS NOMINATIONS TO FILL VACANT UNIVERSAL SERVICE ADMINISTRATIVE COMPANY BOARD OF DIRECTORS POSITION

CC Docket Nos. 96-45, 97-21

Nominations Due By: November 28, 2025

Pursuant to sections 54.703(c) and (d) of the Federal Communications Commission's (Commission or FCC) rules, the Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) seeks nominations to fill the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) Board of Directors (Board) position representing state telecommunications regulators.<sup>1</sup> The position was most recently held by Sarah Freeman, Commissioner, Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission, who stepped down from the Board on September 24, 2025. The term for the position expires on December 31, 2027.

We are persuaded that having Board members with substantive areas of expertise relevant to running a large and complex organization with such skills as accounting, finance, auditing, procurement, data management, and information technology will improve the management, administration, and oversight of USAC. If members of the state telecommunications regulatory group fail to reach consensus on a candidate to serve on the Board, or fail to submit a nomination for the vacant Board member seat, the Chairman of the FCC will select an individual from that group to serve on the Board as outlined in section 54.703(c)(1).<sup>2</sup>

Pursuant to section 54.703(c)(2) of the Commission's rules, each nomination must be captioned "In the Matter of: Nomination for Universal Service Administrator's Board of Directors, CC Docket Nos. 97-21 and 96-45." Nominations may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies.

- Paper Filers: Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and one copy of each filing. Because more than one docket appears in the caption of this proceeding, filers must submit two additional copies for the additional docket.
